COMPASSION: to feel pity or to look with pity and sorrow towards someone or something; to be troubled about.

EX 34.6: when God passed by Moses and declared who He was, He described himself as, "compassionate and gracious"

MATT 9.36: seeing the people [Jesus] felt compassion for them because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd.

COL 3.12: as the chosen of God [saved] we are to put on a heart of compassion towards others

JAMES 5.11: the Lord is full of compassion and is merciful
